CHAPLAINS MESSAGE

That simple three letter word, “but,” is used to qualify a statement that is made and is usually not a big deal. However, there are circumstances when it can cause quite a stir! For example: “How was dinner?” “It was OK, (here it comes) BUT...” That’s when the trouble begins. To make matters worse, that little word is often not actually spoken, but merely implied. Its silent use tends to make matters even more troublesome. I am sure that each of us has been on both sides of the fence, either the user of “but” or the recipient. I would like to suggest that we become more aware of that little word as we approach Thanksgiving. While “but” is a normal part of everyday life, it can limit our gratitude. In fact, what follows that three-letter word can overshadow the positive and make us forget gratitude. We certainly will never be able to eliminate from conversation or use, but we can try to limit it’s restriction of gratitude. It begins with training ourselves to become aware of using it. Then, we can make a conscious effort to rise above it. Perhaps we can tell ourselves, “I know about this “but,” still it will not eliminate my gratitude for what I have.” Another helpful exercise is to begin with the “but” qualifier, so we end on a positive note. So that all of this doesn’t become too confusing, here’s a simple example. “The meeting was productive, BUT it was too long.” That could be replaced in our mind with: “I know the meeting was long, but it was still a good one, and I’m glad I was there.” Or, “The meeting was too long, BUT it was a great meeting.” Give it a try! Happy Thanksgiving!
