CHAPLAINS MESSAGE

Over the years I have met many wonderful married couples. It is inspiring to see their commitment and devotion to one another. In some cases, when one learns more about their story, as it turns out, this was not always the case. Some of these couples survived some rather rocky times. Perhaps one neglected the other, was abusive, abused alcohol or drugs, or even had an affair. Often in these cases, there was a dramatic conversion, forgiveness and new beginning. When that happens, there is a realization that this is how it should have been all along. When they share their stories with others, this is the message: Don't make the same mistake. October is Respect Life Month. The Church will again boldly proclaim the sanctity of life from conception to natural death. It is not uncommon, even in Catholic circles, to shy away from the abortion issue and state that there are many other issues as well. Of course there are. Respect for life means concern for the poor, the sick, the elderly, the homeless, ending violence, and so many more issues. However, it starts at the beginning. When a couple exchanges vows at the altar, they are to begin living their Sacrament immediately. While it is the sad truth that many do not "get it" until later, that doesn't change their responsibility. It is much the same with life. We have to "get it" from the beginning. Certainly it is great when someone comes to the realization that they need to care for life in its later stages, but that's a bit like a married couple "wasting" all those years when they could have been truly loving one another. It works much better if I learn and practice the sacredness of life from the moment life happens than to wait until a later date to begin respecting it. In truth, those that are pro-life are also very active in countless charitable activities in behalf of many others who are in need. For me, it is not a question of acknowledging that there are many issues of pro-life. That can be a deception for ignoring the absolute evil of abortion. It is a question of getting it right from the very beginning. When we do that there are no regrets at a later date, wondering what took us so long. Life is precious, always – from conception to natural death. There's nothing else to say. Keep up the good work and the good fight – for life!

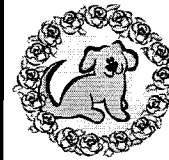

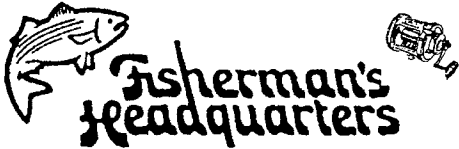

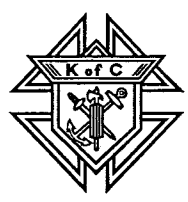
