CHAPLAINS MESSAGE

I assume that most Catholics know that there is a Holy Spirit, and they probably could even add that the Spirit is part of the Holy Trinity. Beyond that, though, I wonder how much the average Catholic really understands. How about you? This year, the Feast of Pentecost, which is really the feast of the Holy Spirit, falls on June 12. In terms of importance on the Church's calendar, Pentecost comes right behind Christmas and Easter. However, I suspect that for most Catholics, it's just another Sunday. In the Gospel of Luke, after the resurrection, Jesus tells His apostles to "stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high" (Luke 24: 49). That "power from on high" is the Holy Spirit. By the way many Catholics live their faith, or should I say don't live their faith, one might wonder if they know what they have! As a kid, our family went on many camping trips. One of the highlights of any camping adventure is the campfire. Once it's going, it is wonderful. However, to get it really blazing sometimes takes a little work. I can remember many times struggling to get that first spark and then madly fanning that tiny flame until it becomes a roaring blaze. As Catholics, we at least have that initial spark, but so many have failed to fan the flames to become a roaring fire! One of my favorite expressions is that the Catholic Church is the Truth without the fire. By that I mean, so many Catholics are taught the Truth, but they have no idea what they have. Looking at how they express their faith, one would be hard pressed to believe that they really do have the Holy Spirit. How about you? The Holy Spirit is not just the correct answer to a question about the Holy Trinity. It is the fire, the power, the breath of God alive in a person of Faith! Happy Pentecost!

June 14th is Flag Day.

The Flag was born in revolutionary America and represents the colonies' fight for independence. Congress first authorized the flag on June 14, 1777. This date is now observed as Flag Day throughout America. It was first stated that there be a star and stripe for each state, making thirteen of both. The first flag rose over thirteen states along the Atlantic Coast with a population of three million people.

Meaning of colors

The colors of the flag have special meaning. The red is for valor and zeal - white is for hope, purity, and cleanliness of life - and blue, the color of heaven, loyalty, sincerity, justice, and truth.

O flag of our Union, To you we'll be true, To your red and white stripes, And your stars on the blue; The emblem of freedom, The symbol of right, We children salute you, O flag fair and bright! *A poem taught in American classrooms nearly a century ago

Flag etiquette

1. The flag should always be flown on national and state holidays
2. The flag should never touch the ground
3. The flag should never be used as drapery or for advertising
4. Torn and faded flag should not be displayed
5. Make sure your flag is in good order and fit for use and replace it if need be
6. The K of C and VFW will dispose your tired old flag with dignity

INSURANCE MATTERS

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things.

Take the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it could very well be that the beneficiary originally designated to receive the proceeds from that policy needs to be updated. If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since been married, that could be updated to reflect your spouse, and even your children.

Most people list a primary beneficiary – that person is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary – an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured.

When I call to arrange your annual “insurance check-up,” one of the matters that we can discuss is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can usually complete the paperwork during the appointment.

I look forward to meeting with you to review all your life insurance policies.
